

Restrictions Exemption Program implementation at ENTS

The Alberta Government supports a Restrictions Exemption Program (REP) to allow businesses and organizations to have certain restrictions removed from them. As of writing, the program is described at <https://www.alberta.ca/covid-19-public-health-actions.aspx>

This policy is effective December 22nd, 2021 and in place until removed.

ARTICLE 1. General

- 1.1. Visitors, including Members and Directors, are required to provide valid documentation which complies with the Restrictions Exemption Program before entering the Space.
 - 1.1.1. “Valid documentation” is as described by the Alberta Government. Examples as of writing include proof of vaccination via QR code, negative privately-paid COVID-19 test, and documented medical exceptions.
- 1.2. Only the Board is authorized to validate compliance with Article 1.1.
- 1.3. Individuals within the Space must not permit entry to those who are not known to have complied with Article 1.1.
 - 1.3.1. For abundance of clarity, Article 1.2 further restricts this by preventing non-directors from scanning or otherwise checking compliance for the purposes of Article 1.1.
 - 1.3.2. The Board must not intentionally disclose whether or not an individual has met the requirements of Article 1.1 with the exception of an individual asking for their own status with respect to Article 1.1.
 - 1.3.2.1. Individuals are explicitly permitted to disclose their communication with the Board to others, if desirable by that person.
- 1.4. With consent of the Member, the Member will have their eligibility recorded alongside their membership information.
 - 1.4.1. Without consent, the Member will be limited to visiting the Space only when Article 1.2 can be satisfied.
- 1.5. The Board will ensure that availability for checking of documents for Article 1.1 compliance is communicated to the membership.
 - 1.5.1. Requests for availability outside of the communicated availability can be sent to the Board through email.
